Our Approach:

Medha works to transform the career journeys of youth across India. Our mission is to realize an India with equal career opportunities for youth, irrespective of gender, class, caste, or religion. Through empirical research and ongoing alumni tracking, we see clear evidence that our approach drives earlier workforce entry, higher earnings, and greater economic independence.






Monthly income after 3 years

While analyzing income data for the 2021 cohort, we identified three high salaries that skewed the average monthly income. These outliers—though valid—are not representative of the broader group's earning pattern.

After removing these 'outliers,' the average monthly income for the 2021 cohort is ₹32,567. This provides a more accurate picture of the cohort's income and aligns with the median and majority of reported salaries.
